Pharmacy Technician

A Pharmacy technician is an individual who, under the supervision of a pharmacist, assists in the performance of activities of the pharmacy department not requiring the professional judgment of a pharmacist. Pharmacy technicians have a broad knowledge of pharmacy practice and are skilled in the techniques required to order, stock, package and prepare medications, but they do not need the advanced college education required of a licensed pharmacist. Pharmacy technicians may perform many of the same duties as a pharmacist; however, all of their work must be checked by a pharmacist before medication can be dispensed to a patient. The Pharmacy Technician program trains individuals for the roles of supportive personnel for hospital and community pharmacies. Primary emphasis is on a wide knowledge of drugs and accuracy in dispensing. Students will learn medical terminology, drug calculation, correct dosage forms, basic pharmacology and the assistant's role in the medical profession.

Duration: 9 months (incl. 520hrs intern)

Surgical Technician

Surgical technicians, also called scrubs or operating room technicians, assist in surgical operations under the supervision of surgeons, registered nurses or other surgical personnel. They are members of operating room teams. Surgical technicians help prepare the operating room by setting up surgical instruments and equipment, sterile drapes and sterile solutions. They assemble both sterile and non-sterile equipment, as well as adjust and check it to ensure it is working properly. They also get patients ready for the operating room, help position them on the operating table and cover them with sterile surgical "drapes." Technicians also observe patients' vital signs, check charts and assist the surgical team with putting on sterile gloves and gowns. During surgery, technicians pass instruments and other sterile supplies to surgeons and surgeon assistants.

Dialysis Technician

Dialysis is the main treatment for End-stage renal disease (ESRD). It replaces three main Kidney tasks: removing waste from the blood, removing excess fluid from the blood and keeping electrolytes (electrically charged particles) in balance. A Dialysis Technician plays a major part in this treatment, as they're responsible for observing patients' records, vital signs prior to and after treatment. Also Technicians monitor blood chemistry to ensure waste products are eliminated properly.

This course will provide students with a comprehensive introduction to: Renal Anatomy and Physiology, patient treatment procedure, how to assess the process of testing chemistry in body fluids, chronic dialysis therapy issues and concerns, intro hemo-dialysis and the list goes on.
